



The 2nd Early Career Researcher Cancer Epidemiology Conference 15 November 2022

Call for Abstracts

The Early Career Researcher (ECR) Cancer Epidemiology Conference, jointly run by the Cancer Council and the Australasian Epidemiological Association (AEA) Cancer Special Interest Group (SIG), is a free, single-day virtual event that will be held on 15th November 2022. The conference is an exciting opportunity for ECRs affiliated with Cancer Council or AEA members working in cancer epidemiology from any research institution to share their research. The conference will feature keynote presentations from two leading cancer epidemiologists, and presentations from the directors of the epidemiology departments at the New South Wales, Victoria, and Queensland Cancer Councils, and the AEA Cancer SIG.

Abstract submission

We are seeking abstracts from ECRs to present at this conference. Presentations will be virtual oral presentations.

Who is eligible

- You should generally be within 5 years post PhD completion, after accounting for any career interruptions.
- PhD students are also welcome to present at the conference.
- To submit an abstract, you must be either affiliated with Cancer Council or an AEA member.
- Abstracts should relate to one or more of the following conference themes:
 - Cancer risk factors, prevention, and screening
 - Cancer treatment, survival, and care
 - o Genetic, molecular and biomarker cancer epidemiology
 - o Methods, data linkage and machine learning in cancer epidemiology
 - Health systems, policies, and equity in cancer
 - o Impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on cancer prevention and control

What you must consider before submission

- Abstracts must be a maximum of **300 words** (excluding title and authors/institutions).
- Projects that are yet to be published or that are very recently published are welcome.
